
Back Up and Push

Widely known. **DATE:** Early 1900's; My Creole Belle by Lampe 1900; Rubber Dolly late 1800's; **RECORDING INFO:** Skillet Lickers; Flatt & Scruggs & the Foggy Mountain Boys; Bill Monroe; McLain Family; **OTHER NAMES:** Rubber Doll.Dolly (Rag) My Creole Belle/Belles; **NOTES:** Back Up and Push and Rubber Dolly evolved from the melody of Jens Bodewalt Lampe's piano rag with song lyrics, "My Creole Belles" which was published in Detroit, Michigan by Whitney-Warner in 1900. It was the melody to the second strain by J.B Lampe (1869-1929)) that became popular during the early 1900's. "My Creole Belle" by Mississippi John Hrt is a reworking of Lampe's melody and lyrics.
